

PROFILE OF A PLAYER

Keith McDonald



Keith's love of card games began when he was about 10 years old. His mother was often quite sick and confined to bed. As she lay in a large double bed, his sisters and he would sneak into the room to play card games. Eventually fighting would begin and his father would arrive to throw them out of the room reminding them that they must not disturb mother! His Mum, though, was obviously bored and actively

encouraged them to appear with the deck of cards. He has four sisters and two brothers, all of whom have been very understanding in playing a secondary role to bridge.

When he started work at the National Mutual Life (1968), his colleagues were delighted to find they had a five hundred player. In May 1974, when he started work at the University of Queensland, he again had a regular lunch time card school. Again five hundred was the game.

After Marianna De Jong commenced work in their Department in late 1974, she introduced them to bridge and a relatively new system called Precision, invented by C. C. Wei.

In 1976, the University was to play a match with the Queensland Bridge Association. The University was short a pair so Keith and his colleague, Don Walker, in ignorant bliss, agreed to help playing against the Women's Team. They won, but couldn't see why the Ladies seemed upset that they could not tell them exactly what they were bidding; and what were discarding methods pray-tell!

Marianna organised for Keith to play at a Dutch club where he met many interesting people including Marya Jones and Bill Verstegen. Marya and Keith then started playing at the Queensland Contract Bridge Club.

Driving in for the first time to QCBC, Keith reminded Marya that we were playing weak 2's. He opened 2 hearts and Marya responded with 7 hearts and Keith was very disappointed in the 10 point hand that descended to the table. Marya explained that he needed a little more for a strong 2 hearts. Keith explained they were playing weak 2's and she told him not to be silly, she only played strong 2.s. The next hand, Marya opened 2 hearts, so with his 14 count he bid 6 hearts (He was timid). She was most upset with him and told him he should never raise a weak 2 on such rubbish. He apologised. Their opponents were a mother and daughter, Marion and Kym Cooke.

In Keith's own words "I cannot describe the joy I found with this wonderful group at Manning Street. Dr Denis Priest, an academic from the University of Queensland, gave me considerable help with the game. He had won his first tournament event, a whist drive, at the age of five."

Every month, Keith would ask Fay Landy for his green master-point certificate. She would always smile, and hand him a certificate for 30/40 greenpoints. Tom Landy offered books and articles to read. There were many helpful people, whom he regards as close friends.

Keith admired the talented list of Chairmen of QCBC, including Mrs Evelyn Ahern, Mrs Elaine Poulsen, and Mrs Claire Hyne. In 1980, the President asked him if he would represent the club at Meetings of the Queensland Bridge Association. Hence began his long association with the organisation. He joined

the QCBC Board in 1983 and has been a Director since. He had the pleasure of opening the new premises, with Nelly Hatton and Josie Tully, in 1992, as President of the State organisation.

In the late 70's, he lectured at the Queensland University of Technology. In 1983, he was acting Head of the University of Queensland Press and during that time, the Press published 2 volumes on bridge by Dr Priest.

Keith has gone on to an untiring involvement in Bridge at all levels. (See previous note on Page 1). He lists some highlights of his time as President of OBA as

- ♦ The commencement of a Scheme to fund Clubs in the purchase of capital items by way of loans.
- ♦ The growth of membership, principally because of the steady climate in administration.
- ♦ The 1988 Be-Centennial event held by the QBA.
- Opening new premises for a number of clubs, each now with a plaque.
- ♦ The success of the Gold Coast event.
- ♦ Launching the History of Australian Bridge by Cathy Chua at the 1993 ANC.
- ♦ The expansion of the number of clubs acquiring premises.
- ♦ The excellent support from all levels of Government. The State Government has been a very major contributor to our success.

Finally, from an article in "*The Sunday Mail*" which featured Keith and was written by John Hay, Keith describes Bridge.

"It's the most democratic of pastimes, and cuts across social barriers like nobody's business.

Players turn up at bridge clubs in expensive Mercedes Benz and old jalopies. They come from all sections of society. Doctors, cab drivers, housewives, labourers, academics, journalists, lawyers, sandwich shop keepers."

If he had a second chance to start life again, he says he would want to include all facets of my bridge experience; that is not to say that there are not aspects that he would have preferred took a different route.
